# **About Cipla Sikkim**

Cipla Sikkim comprises of two units - Rangpo and Rorathang established in 2008 and 2017, respectively. Jointly, the two sites cover an area of 27 acres and manufacture tablets, hard gelatin capsules, nasal sprays, rotacaps, FFS respules and Metered Dose Inhalers (MDIs).

Golden Cross Pharma Ltd (a Cipla subsidiary) was inaugurated in 2009. This facility based in Rorathang occupies an area of 9.4 acres and manufactures tablets, liquid orals, shampoos, topical preparations and Polyethylene terephthalate (PET) bottles.

Our site in Sikkim is amongst Cipla's 40+ manufacturing units around the world. Cipla is a global pharmaceutical company that produces 50+ dosage forms and 1,500+ products. We are committed to ensuring access to high quality and life-saving medicines.



# Digital Learning Education and Development (D-Lead)

With a goal to make education inclusive and equitable for all children, we launched a digital literacy initiative. D-lead gives a seamless digital learning experience to students by providing tablets pre-loaded with content for class 10, structured to the state board curriculum.

Distributed to children from government schools near Cipla units, this initiative advances the government's National Education Policy encouraging digital education. During COVID-19, this digital access gave our children the tools to continue learning even as schools remained closed.

#### **Infrastructure Development and Digitisation of Schools**

On 1st June 2022, we inaugurated a newly constructed 8-classroom primary section in Government Secondary School, Mamring Pakyong. We installed a TabLab - a tablet-based Information and Communications Technology (ICT) Lab with preloaded content aligned to the state board curriculum that would improve digital literacy among children and build access to online learning.

The programme facilitates digital learning without dependence on the internet. It eases the teacher's workload and empowers them to personalise learning for every child.



# Mobile Science Labs (MSL)

To make the learning process for children integrated and engaging we partnered with Agastya International Foundation in 2019. We support the MSL programme, reaching out to students across 20 schools.



# Connecting the Community to Livelihood Opportunities in COVID-19

In the wake of COVID-19 and the lockdown, many families lost their source of income and needed support to get back on their feet. To support women's self help groups in Rorathang, we provided 8 tailoring machines to facilitate livelihood opportunities.





### Safeguarding Frontline Workforce

We provided Personal Protective Equipment (PPEs), masks, gloves and sanitisers to the local district administration including hospitals and Primary Health Centres.



We supported Mangan hospital with an ambulance to reach out to COVID-19 positive patients in need of emergency medical attention. This ambulance is currently running in the urban Public Health Centre of Gangtok.



## Reaching Out to Communities with Dry Ration Kits

Together with the village Panchayats of Rangpo and Majitar, we handed over dry ration and hygiene kits to 200+ families of daily wage earners.

We support communities with immediate relief during natural disasters. In 2021- 2022, our work included flood relief in Tamil Nadu and Kerala, shelter, and relief material distribution for the Mumbai landslide, as well as support during the Mahad and Chiplun floods. In Odisha, in collaboration with HelpAge India and the local administration, we distributed hygiene kits, face masks and dry ration during Cyclone Yaas.



#### Rooted in our legacy of care for the last 25 years

The diagnosis of a serious illness makes relentless physical, emotional and financial demands, not only on patients but also on their loved ones. It was to support them in their most difficult times that **Cipla founded the Palliative**Care & Training Centre in 1997 in Warje, Pune. Since then, we have served over 20,000 patients and their families free of cost.

Today, we have **24 partners** across **18 cities** in India providing palliative care services. Together, we launched the **Saath Saath** helpline **(1800-202-7777)**: This national toll-free number is staffed by trained palliative care volunteers who listen, assess, and link callers to the nearest palliative care provider. **Saath Saath** could make all the difference to someone who might be in pain and needs support. We hope that everyone will play their part in spreading awareness about the helpline.
