1. **Project execution** - All projects will be implemented directly through Cipla or Cipla Foundation, Cipla's Principal implementation agency for CSR activities.
2. **The modalities of utilisation of funds** – The utilisation of funds will be as per the terms and considered laid in the Memorandum of Understanding entered for each project.
3. **Implementation schedule** - All projects involve outlay for FY 2025-26, as approved by the Board.
4. **Monitoring and Reporting of the project under each programme** - The monitoring of the CSR Activities may be undertaken in the form of periodical review, field visit, third party audit or certification, periodical reports etc. The CSR Committee shall review the progress on Annual Action Plan preferably on quarterly basis but not less than twice in a year.
5. The Company may take up additional projects other than those stated above, with necessary approvals as per the Companies Act, 2013.
6. **Impact Assessment** will be undertaken in accordance with rule 8(3)(a) of Corporate Social Responsibility Rules, 2014 (as amended) for all those projects having outlays of one crore rupees or more, and which have been completed one year or more, based on actual spends made on the individual projects.
